HUSBAND NOTES: Joseph PINE

General: NOTE FROM MOTHER: check and compare birth data with microfilm records of Boston, MA. Uncle Reu said that Joseph Pine #1 should be exchanged with Samuel Pine, #6 in the birth line.

NOTE: From research during the vacation of MO; IL; IA; MO, the information of the death of Joseph stated that he had told his sons to take their mother and sisters to the west with the other Saints and stay with the church. The trek west is unknown, but needs to be researched to see what Captain and group they migrated with. LMKF

WIFE NOTES: Adelia Ann Sparrow WINN

General: Burial Story: Uncle Reu Nay and nephew Dalton L. Gibson went to the Pioneer Cemetery in San Bernardino, CA to try to find the burial plot for Delia Winn. The caretaker told them that the book for the years that they were searching was not available as it had been lost or destroyed. They did not check with the county records to see if she was actually buried there.

FAMILY STORY: from Clifton Rue Nay from his mother Thankful Lucy Pine Nay. Samuel Pine, that lived in Yucipa, and owned a great deal of orchards and land, was one of the original settlers in that part of the county. (His. of San Bernardino County, CA---DAR Lib. Washington, DC). When Brigham Young sent for the pioneers to return to Utah because of persecution, Samuel did not want to return. It meant his records would be stricken from the Church records at that time because Brigham Young was calling back the settlers of the CA valley that was hoped to be part of the Utah Territory. Delia Winn Pine, returned to Utah. She periodically would return to CA to try to convince her son to return to Utah and or restore his records in the church. Several years before she died she made another trip to CA and then was too sick to travel back to Utah. She settled in CA and later died there. NOTE: There is a change

NOTE: There is a chance that she could have been buried there in Yucipa on the family homestead. The family group sheets states that she was buried in the Pioneer Cemetery in San Bernardino, San Bernardino Co., CA.

CHILD NOTES: Dudley PINE

General: I believe this is the Dr. Dudley Pine that is in the book, "Great Men of Minnesota and Montana" (title similar if not correct). FHC film # . He stated in his bio that his grandfather was the Joseph Pine of the Revolutionary War, who immigrated from Naples, Italy. (LMKF)

CHILD NOTES: Samuel Cook PINE

General: Samuel C. Pine married 1st Mahalia Strong and 2nd in 1855, Jane Morrison of Buffalo, NY.

CHILD NOTES: Lucy Thankful PINE

Burial (31 Jul 1897): She and John Nay are buried next to each other on the corner of Central and Grand, #128-E, #128-F.

General: Birth and death dates from headstone in Monroe cemetery. Ordinance dates from Ancestral File, Family History center, SLC UT.

Thankful Lucy Pine married 3 times. The first was to Orin or Orren Packard. She had one son before he died.

Thankful was also rebaptized the 24 Aug 1851. It is known that she came across the plains early from Illinois with her mother and brothers and a sister.
